

Saratoga Lake Sailing Club offers a warm welcome to all persons sincerely interested in sailing. You'll find our members come from all walks of life, and display a remarkable variety of personalities and temperaments. Of course, we are bound by one strong common tie -- a love of sailing.

From its position at the foot of a hill which leads down to Kaydeross Park at the North end of the Lake, the Club is most advantageously situated to use the prevailing winds which buffet the edge of Snake Hill, some 2 1/2 miles away. The SLSC Clubhouse is adequate for storage, sanitary facilities and shelter when it storms. A pier stretches 170' into the Lake, providing plenty of space for fitting out each Sunday when some 25-30 sailboats are preparing for the afternoon races.

For those who dry sail their boats, rack space is available. Racks are owned by the Club members individually and they are installed and dismantled each Spring and Fall.

Just off the shore, on either side of the dock, space is available for owners who like to fit out and sail directly away from permanent moorings. Each of these is also prepared, installed and owned by the member.

Special events are part of the formal Club program. These include Summer evening parties under the stars, a clam bake, picnics and Regattas. During the Winter, there are dances and dinners which are usually held at local restaurants. These include a Trophy Dinner at which outstanding sailors are rewarded by the Race Committee, and the Commodore's Ball.

Membership fees and dues are low because the work of the Club is shared by the members. Each is expected to do his share.
